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1.0 Background

Neoen Australia Pty Ltd (Neoen) (the approval holder) submitted a referral under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* (EPBC Act) in February 2021, for the development of a large-scale battery energy storage system (the 'Territory Battery') in the Australian Capital Territory (ACT).

The Territory Battery Energy Storage System (TBESS) will be constructed on Block 1635 and 1634, in the District of Belconnen. The proposed action area is adjacent to Stockdill Drive, and the existing Stockdill Substation.

On 22 March 2021, the Commonwealth department responsible for administering the EPBC Act (the Department), determined that the proposed action had the potential to have a significant impact on matters of national environmental significance (MNES), and was therefore determined to be a controlled action. The relevant matters protected under the EPBC Act were listed threatened species and communities (section 18 and section 18A).

The action was assessed under the bilateral agreement between the Commonwealth and the ACT Government and was approved subject to conditions on 31 May 2024.

Conditions attached to the approval included requirements relating to:

- Clearing limits
- Pre-clearance surveys
- Management plan preparation, submission, publication and implementation
- Securing and managing offset sites
- Notification requirements
- Compliance records and reporting
- Independent audits
- Completion of the action.

Construction of the project has not yet commenced.
